**ICHABOD: WHERE'S THE GLORY?
HAS THE AMERICAN CHURCH LOST ITS GLORY?**

1st Samuel 4:10-22

Then she named the child "Ichabod," saying, "The glory has departed from Israel!" because the ark of God had been captured and because of her father-in-law and her husband.

1st Samuel 4:21

10. *So the Philistines fought, and Israel was defeated, and every man fled to his tent. There was a very great slaughter, and there fell of Israel thirty thousand foot soldiers.*

11. *Also the ark of God was captured and the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, died.*

12. *Then a man of Benjamin ran from the battle line the same day and came to Shiloh with his clothes torn and dirt on his head.*

13. *Now when he came, there was Eli, sitting on a seat by the wayside watching, for his heart trembled for the ark of God. And when the man came into the city and told it, all the city cried out.*

14. *When Eli heard the noise of the outcry, he said, "What does the sound of this tumult mean? And the man came quickly and told Eli.*

15. *Eli was ninety-eight years old, and his eyes were so dim that he could not see.*

16. *Then the man said to Eli, "I am he who came from the battle. And I fled today from the battle line." And he said, "What happened, my son?"*

17. *So the messenger answered and said, "Israel has fled before the Philistines, and there has been a great slaughter among the people. Also your two sons, Hophni and Phinehas, are dead, and the ark of God has been captured."*

18. *Then it happened, when he made mention of the ark of God, that Eli fell off the seat backward by the side of the gate; and his neck was broken, and he died, for the man was old and heavy. And he had judged Israel forty years.*

19. *Now his daughter-in-law, Phinehas' wife, was with child, due to be delivered; and when she heard the news that the ark of God was captured,*

and that her father-in-law and her husband were dead, she bowed herself and gave birth, for her labor pains came upon her.

20. And about the time of her death the women who stood by her said to her, "Do not fear, for you have borne a son." But she did not answer, not did she regard it.

21. Then she named the child "Ichabod," saying, "The glory has departed from Israel!" because the ark of God had been captured and because of her father-in-law and her husband.

22. And she said, "The glory has departed from Israel, for the ark of God has been captured."

Background

Israel suffered a terrible loss to the Philistines, who are the modern day Palestinians and were very warlike. The Israelites had had a previous loss of 4000 men. This loss made the Israelites foolishly decide to take the Ark of the Covenant, the most revered and prized object in Israel, into battle as a sort of good luck charm, since it was symbolic of the Lord's presence and glory. This obviously displeased the Lord, and the Israelites not only lost, with about 30,000 killed, but also the Ark of the Covenant was stolen by the Philistines. The reasons the Philistines were so successful in battle against Israel, before David's reign, were they were more advanced in their weapons of war and used iron weapons, and also Israel's tribes were disorganized and not in unity. The most famous Philistine was Goliath. The Philistines worshiped the false gods: Baal, Ashtoreth, and Dagon. Stealing the Ark of the Covenant proved to be a terrible mistake, and the Philistines saw the statue of their god Dagon fall over prostrate before the Ark and finally his head break off. In addition the Philistines were inflicted with hemorrhoids, a plague of rats, and boils. After 7 months of this, they loaded the Ark on a cart drug by a team of cows and sent it back into Israelite territory. The Ark of the Covenant was a small gold covered box which contained the Tablets of Stone on which were inscribed the 10 Commandments, Aaron's rod, a jar of manna, and the first Torah(first 5 books of Bible) scroll.

Eli was the high priest and judge of Israel during this time. Eli was a good man and loved the Lord, but he failed to exercise authority of a parent over his children. His sons, Phinehas and Hophni, lacked Eli's character, and yet he put them in the priestly office anyway, where they disgraced the office. They claimed and took more than their share of the sacrifices and had sex with women in the doorway of the tent of meeting. Eli was warned twice about his sons, and he tried to reason with them and asked them why they did such things, but he never disciplined them and did not put them out of

the temple, thus placing all of them under a curse. Things were so bad that the people began to hate going to the temple and offering to the Lord.

Why did the Glory Depart?

Because the Ark of the Covenant, that had been taken by the Philistines, was symbolic of God's presence. The Israelites felt that God had left them. They had lost a great battle. Their priests were dead. Their leader who, in spite of his weaknesses, was a man of God and loved the Lord, was dead. No doubt they lost this battle and the Ark of the Covenant because of their sin, and they eventually would repent and seek the Lord and win future battles with the Philistines.

Has the Glory departed from the American Church as a whole: Comments on the Body of Christ in America-(By this I mean all ministries and churches regardless of denomination)

It is not about us. It is about God and His kingdom on earth as it is in heaven. He has chosen Christians to play a significant role in showing the world what His kingdom looks like. “I look at the whole religious scene today, and all I see are inventions and ministries of man and flesh. It’s mostly powerless. It has no impact on the world. Why has the Glory departed from much of the American Church?

1. **Pastors are preaching either no Word or a diluted Gospel with messages full of “Chicken Soup Stories” or an emphasis on entertainment and “seeker friendly” formats.** *“Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of My pasture!” says the LORD. Therefore thus says the LORD God of Israel against the shepherds who feed My people: “You have scattered My flock, driven them away, and not attended to them. Behold, I will attend to you for the evil of your doings,” say the Lord. “But I will gather the remnant of My flock out of all countries where I have driven them, and bring them back to their folds; and they shall be fruitful and increase. I will set up shepherds over them who will feed them...”* (Jeremiah 23:1-4a).

All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work. 2nd Timothy 3:16-17

For the word of God is living and powerful and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit and of joints and marrow and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. Hebrews 4:12

Remind them of these things, charging them before the Lord not to strive about words to no profit, to the ruin of the hearers. Be diligent to present yourselves approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of truth. 2. We make heroes out of men instead of realizing that there is only one hero, Jesus, and the ground at the foot of the cross is level.

For you see your calling, brethren, that not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called, But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty, and the base things of the world and the things which are despised, God has chosen, and the things which are not, to bring to nothing the things that are, THAT NO FLESH SHOULD GLORY IN HIS PRESENCE. 1st Corinthians 1:26-29

“After nearly sixty years of the countless moral failings of supposed giants of faith with midget-sized character, the Charismatic and Pentecostal church is still hungering for the next hero. This speaks volumes of our lack of discernment due to a lack of experience with the real thing-JESUS. At the very least, let’s take hold of Paul’s wisdom regarding reputation: *For it is not he who commends himself that is approved, but he whom the Lord commends* (2nd Corinthians 10:18). 3. The Church has bought into the “politically correct” doctrine and is afraid to speak truth boldly, such as Jesus is the ONLY way to heaven, for fear of looking foolish to the world.

Preach the word! Be ready in season and out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort, with all longsuffering and teaching. For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine, but according to their own desires, because they have itching ears, they will heap up for themselves teachers, and they will turn their ears away from the truth, and be turned aside to fables. But you be watchful in all things, endure afflictions, do the work of an evangelist, fulfill your ministry. 2nd Timothy 4:2-5

But in vain they do worship Me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men. Matthew 15:9

Woe unto them who call evil, good, and good, evil; who put darkness for light, and light for darkness; who put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter. Isaiah 5:20

4. Most of the Church is prayerless.

Pray without ceasing. 1st Thessalonians 5:17

And he spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint. Luke 18:1

You have not because you ask not. James 4:2

This poor man cried out, and the LORD heard him and saved him out of all his troubles. Psalm 34:6

Call to Me, and I will answer you, and show you great and mighty things which you do not know. Jeremiah 33:3

Moreover, as for me, far be it from me that I should sin against the LORD in ceasing to pray for you....1st Samuel 12:23

5. Most of the Church is walking in fear.

And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell. Matthew 10:28

Do not fear, little flock, for it is your Father’s good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Luke 12:32

And there will be signs in the sun, in the moon, and in the stars, and on the earth distress of nations, with perplexity, the sea and the waves roaring, men’s hearts failing them from fear and the expectation of those things which are coming on the earth, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to happen, look up and lift up your heads, because your redemption draws near. His plan is to give us a future and a hope-no matter what happens in the earth (Proverbs 23:18 & Jeremiah 29:11). He sends His word to encourage us, to comfort us, and to prepare us for the days ahead. He doesn’t send His word to judge us-for Christ came not to condemn the world but to save it (John 3:17). He sends His word to turn our hearts towards Him-not to scare the hell out of us and cause us to think He is evil in His intent towards us. Any words or thoughts in your head about anything other than the supreme goodness of God are twisted lies. True prophets and true followers of Christ know the personality and nature of Christ. They know that God does not will that any should perish but that all should be redeemed. Jesus is in the seek-and-save business, not the condemn-and-annihilate business.” Julia Loren

6. We are not seeking first the Kingdom of God.

No man can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Matthew 6:24

But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. Matthew 6:33

“Christians who are now living, working, or even going to church in the wrong places are there because they made major decisions based on what they wanted or what others wanted them to do, rather than seeking first what the Lord wanted them to do for the sake of His kingdom. To seek His kingdom first means more than firing up a prayer here and there for Him to guide us, and then go and immediately do what we want to do. It requires seeking Him until we find Him. When it takes longer than we think it should take to find Him, it could be because we have drifted so far from Him. Now is the time to do whatever it takes to get in the will of the Lord. There will be an increasingly high price to pay for those who are not. There will be increasing peace and joy for those who are.” Rick Joyner

7. Many of the mainline denominations are not open to the gifts and ministry of the Holy Spirit.

Bu you shall receive power [dunamis] when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth. Acts 1:8

So what can we do about the lack of Glory in the Lord’s Church in America?

1. Wake up: *Proclaim this among the nations: Prepare for war! Wake up the mighty men. Let all the men of war draw near; Let them come up. Joel 3:9 AND And do this, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep; for now our salvation is nearer than when we first believed. Romans 13:11*
2. Repent: *...unless you repent, you will all likewise perish. Luke 13:3*
3. Pray: *If My people who are called by My name will humble themselves and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land. 2nd Chronicles 7:14*

Tonight are you willing to humble yourselves, pray, seek the Lord’s face (instead of His giving hand), and turn from your sin and repent. Are you willing to recommit your life to Christ?

If you really would do these things in sincerity and truth, He would hear from heaven and forgive you and heal your land. We, as a corporate body, need to do this for our individual churches and ministries. The Lord loves the Church, the Body of Christ on this

earth, and gave Himself for it. He is coming back for a *glorious Church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that it should be holy and without blemish* (Ephesians 5:27). Will you be part of that glorious Church?
